"Baptist Theological Institute."—In company with a friend, a few days since, we visited the ground and building, now in process of completion, belonging to this Institute, and truly we found it a very gratifying ex-periment.

The building is one of the most substan-tial kind, four stories high above the basement;

it is fifty-four feet from the eaves to the ground; each story contains twenty-four rooms, mostly in all.

Col. David Gibson, who had been spoken of through the District as a candidate, through a friend, declined permitting his name to be used by the Convention.

It was voted, that each county should have

one vote in the Convention, for every one hundred voters—that is to say, the counties of Grant, Carroll and Gallatin, send each, and the county of Boone, fourteen.
