Next morning we went to the "White," or "Cave Caves," a mile distant from the Cave House. This, though only a quarter of a mile long, abounded with wondrous incrustations; columns formed of calcareous deposits, first, in the shape of stalactites and stalagmites, afterwards united midway between the top and bottom of the cavern. One of the latter is thirty feet high, and is six inches in diameter. There are many similar ones and rows of them, forming temples, curules, organ pipes, grottoes, &c. One of those beautiful little points, which the guide said had no name yet, I called "Chatterbox's Grotto," in honor of you, which he says shall hereafter designate it. He also promised to apply the name of "Mammoth Cave" to the interesting object in the Mammoth Cave.

The most curious one of my "Grottoes," is near the middle of the "White." It is a great flat, white space, where the water has collected. The water is so shallow that the sides of this Cave alone, would be worth a pilgrimage from Witten.

The Caves are owned by Dr. Croghan, of Louisville, who has secured them by a purchase of 2,000 acres of land. The house is kept by Mr. A. Miller, with his son, Mr. Moore, to superintend the domestic arrangements. Extensive and valuable additions are now making to the premises, the better to accommodate the increasing number of visitors who are expected hither to promote their health, gain some knowledge of our country, and truly, in my humble judgment, there is the place better adapted to the accomplishment of these ends, than the Mammoth Cave and Kentucky.
