MINISTER TO CHINA.—Hon. A. H. Everett, accompanied by his lady, left this city yesterday morning for New York, whence he sails on Saturday in the ship Canota for China. In Vera Cruz no notice of blockade was given to the foreign Consuls, which had caused great umbrage to the majority of them—but notice was sent to the Captains of all the neutral vessels of war (French, Spanish and English) anchored at Sacrificios. The Commander of the American squadron states that the Royal Mail Steam packets would be allowed to communicate and to land their mails and passengers, and to take specie.
